- Activity room was in use
- Game room was in use
- Fitness equipment was in use
- Residents were gathered throughout common spaces
- Common areas were inviting and comfortably furnished

Staff

- You were warmly greeted upon entering
- Staff was friendly, professional and personable
- Staff was kind to residents/knew them by name
- Staff was appropriately dressed
- Management team was welcoming, personable and experienced
- Staff was able to answer your questions clearly

Residents

- You were introduced to residents
- You spoke with residents about their experience
- Residents appeared to be good neighbours
- Residents seemed happy and comfortable

A Helpful Guide to Senior Living Options

Independent Living

Residential apartment communities for seniors who do not require specialized medical care (although personal home care services are usually available through third-party providers). These communities often offer housekeeping and maintenance services, dining, events and transportation – usually for a single, all-inclusive monthly rental rate.

Assisted Living

Communities where residents enjoy similar services to those offered with independent living, along with access to assistance with activities of daily living such as bathing, grooming, getting dressed and remembering to take medications properly.

Memory Care

Communities that provide specialized care for those living with Alzheimer's or other forms of dementia in a secure, structured environment with specially trained staff.

Residential Care Homes

Traditional private homes that have been adapted to provide care services for a smaller group of residents (usually no more than 15) and can offer both short-term and long-term care.

Long-Term Care Homes

Also called nursing homes, facilities that provide 24-hour skilled medical care, rehabilitation assistance, pain management and hospice care.

Home Care

Support and care services similar to those offered at assisted living communities, provided in a senior's home or apartment.
